Girl Scouts' Women's Leadership Forum Spotlights Businesswomen in the Arts

Baltimore—Girl Scouts of Central Maryland (GSCM) will host its 3rd annual Women's Leadership Forum on Wednesday, March 11, 2009 from 5:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. at the Baltimore Sun Building, 501 N. Calvert Street. The forum will include a Q&A and panel discussion with arts industry businesswomen Elizabeth Cockey, painter, author and art therapist; Rebecca Hoffberger, founder and director, American Visionary Art Museum and Toby Orenstein, owner, Toby's Dinner Theater and founder, artistic director and president of the Columbia Center for Theatrical Arts (CCTA) Board of Directors.
