


#### **Pinochle Bugs Donation**

She accomplished this through her online sales efforts. She and her mom both believe if she were able to host booth sales last year she would have sold even more. Gwen has been working to become top cookie entrepreneur since she went to her first Top Cookie Seller event in 2018. She has been the Top Cookie Seller for Harford County for the past four years and has finally achieved her ultimate goal. Gwen, now a Girl Scout Cadette, has been a member of Girl Scouts for six years and, Gwen is autistic. Gwen's mother says that because she is a few years behind her peers, she sometimes struggles with social events but, she added, "We are finding ways to make it better."

Her mother remembered two years ago when she and Gwen attended the Cookie Kick-Off event. #### Girl Scouts of Central Maryland Hosts AmeriCorps VISTAS

GSCM was fortunate to host 14 members of the AmeriCorps programs: 4 VISTAs which are through the local government; 1 Volunteer America/State, which is through the Governor's office, and 9 National Civilian Conservation Corps (NCCC) members who are placed by the federal AmeriCorps headquarters office. It is very prestigious to have been awarded VISTAs from all three AmeriCorps levels in one year. The four AmeriCorps Vistas assisted with membership recruitment. Our Volunteer America VISTA laid out plans for the 9 NCCC members to assist with property maintenance at Camp Whippoorwill and Camp Woodlands April 1 through May 3. In addition to cleaning roofs, cutting down trees and clearing camp sites, the NCCC members took part in a tree planting ceremony with Delegate Nic Kipke and Alex Sievers from the Governor's Office on Service and Volunteerism.
